- Reason: Planning on marketing more due to increase in membership
- Questions
- Chad: rso account, have under \$12,000, allocated towards other events
- Would be taking from own
- Jian: where are you getting food?
- Taipei cafe in chinatown
- How often does it happen
- First time this year
- Where are numbers for evetn
- Turnout was 110, with expected 70
- Will food be free?
- Based on how much, will be partially subsidized; if enough people order, will be covered in full
- Everyone gets to order?
- People fill out google form and put in order for taipei and hand out to students
- If there's an excess, how do you
- People venmo ahead of time, if not, they can pay day-of
- TASA will pay them back after they make deposit
- How much was used by $\$ 1 \mathrm{k}$ allocated and by student purchases?
- Ordered 1500,500 split between 70 students
- Chad: also for socializing, people place order and will they grab and go or will people stay?
- Book rooms in the library, people are welcome to stay if they want, people usually leave but some stay
- Ishaan: \$2000 worth of orders, will you wait until end to get excess
- More like a deposit, they deposit full amount to make sure they pick up order, then they calculate and venmo the money back

- Chad: is there an event if they're just having people order it
- They paid for 4 members food
- Using personal venmo for RSO is illegal
- Sounds like a money generation scheme
- Stipulation: in person audit, no venmo(can't get personal venmo accounts)
- Don't understand free range of everyone ordering what they want
- Could take orders until they hit $\$ 1500$, they take loss if they don't reach it
- It's a subsidy but you're getting a deposit
- If they're not collecting funding, students don't have 1500 to fund it
- Does this event have any merit? There's no social aspect, not enhancing student life, would be different if people were sitting in Hutch eating
- Jian: how does this advance the goals of TASA?
- Jian motions to not fun basis that venmo thing is illegal, doesn't advance TASA goals

- Jian: How many people went last year?
- 30-40 people
- Ishaan:
- Hotel/travel cost is from last year
- 40 people in 4 hotel rooms
- Transportation
- Bus from first charter
- $\$ 300$ food
- For the duration of the conference, funds dinners
- Some food is ordered in, some for snacks
- Why don't you leave and come back and not get a hotel?
- Not worth it to just commute regularly
- Not feasible to 3 days straight
- Discussion
- Chad: don't understand why they don't commute
- Driving there is 40 min
- Wouldn't be cheaper
- If we half expenses, wouldn't be in best interest to force different recommendation
- It's not feasible to come back/get ready at 5 am for event to just drive
- Ishaan: Bus route wouldn't be an option at 2 am
- Chad: wouldn't expect people to get hotel downtown for chicago event

- Jian: did you send interest form?
- 55 people signed up, undershot with budget asked
- Guarav: what's changed for rso
- Big emphasis on activism
- Quad display and meeting topics being more intellectual, driven up interest
- Making sure to find people who are interested
- Previously only marketed for students for life, making effort to reach out to other rsos
- Ishaan: where hotel/flight costs?
- In expedia:
- Google flights:
- Sending email
- Guarav: when rso have travel requests, usually falls short. What is a realistic number?
- Last year: 12 people signed up, 11 went
- At most, expect 5 people to drop but above what they requested
- People understand what it demands of them
- Make up of group is low income people
- Completely in person?
- All in person
- Asked about pro rates for hotels in DC
- March for life has specific recommended hotels but prices have gone up
- No better prices than what was found
- Ishaan: what time for commuting?
- Commuting thursday evening for student schedules
- Messes up flight prices
- Applying for $\$ 1 \mathrm{k}$, any other fundraising?
- 3 main goals: activism, community service, education
- It's for service, they donate the money
- Can't see them doing an on-campus fundraiser
- \$1k would be given retroactively, would go towards next year
- Award was helpful for paying for march last year
- Last year's allocations had to be dipped into
- Lauren: Have you communicated with your advisor?
- Approved request but have documentation
- University has discounts for flights (recommended by Lauren)
- Discussion
- Ishaan: abstaining from voting aspect
- Jian: chose most expensive hotel
- Guarav: they pick most expensive knowing it will be halved,
- Decide the count of people to send (40 is very big)
- Chad: they're not expecting personal contribution for a high-ticket event
- Unrealistic to send every single member
- Ishaan: going by number of people, it's reasonable
- Don't know any club that sends 40 people, debate and MUN don't send that much
- Chad: fund them lump sum amount if they have student contributions, factor in cheaper/realistic hotels (flights are reasonable)
- Traveling in broad daylight, ubers are unnecessary to hotel
- Cap food at $\$ 60 /$ person
- Jian: conference tickets get discount for groups of 10+ (not necessary for lump sum)
- Guarav: keep in mind other high requests, people can see what was funded
- Lauren: funded general meeting costs, could this be recurring?
- Jian: Halving everything except tickets, 20 people attendance
- \$3435 last year (doubled last year)
- Giving lump sum gives sgfc more leeway
- Chad: is $\$ 7000$ too much/little?
- Funds Attendance is for 20 people
- Jian motion lump sum of $\$ 7 \mathrm{k}$ because allowing attendance to double

- This fall, they toured UChicago's real estate, funding allowed them to eat in hyde park at Bob's Pizza
- In spring event, had 90 students attend and are only real estate RSO
- The second is for travel accommodations for speakers

- Ishaan: Is this for an alumni event, the second event? Other business RSOs choose to do events over zoom
- Having people to provide better interaction because of lack of opportunities
- Job was received through speakers brought through this event
- Ishaan: on flight costs, 630 for roundtrip to NY
- Based on spring event, 2 speakers flown in
- They went over allocated
- One was over $\$ 1 \mathrm{k}$ and 500
- They were happy to bridge gap, but they felt 600 was conservative
- Jian: meals for visit, when is it occuring, how long are visits
- early/late afternoon
- Haven't figured out dates yet, but seems to be most available to speakers
- An hour/hour and a half
- Also depends on programming
- Chad: are site visits open to REIG/uchicago community?
- In past, all events have been geared towards REIG
- Has listhost with 100+ names
- Working to open it up to more people
- For speaker in november, is there a date
- Based on work schedule
- No exact date
- Late fall, early winter
- Are you marketing nov speaker event? Expect 32 people to come?
- No because no date, might change to early dec
- Had 90+ students register so 32 students is reasonable
- Discussion
- Ishaan: 600 for flights is outrageous
- Chad: doesn't believe they're open to all students
- Guarav: you can't be exclusive society
- Chad: events that will have impact on large number of people, more discretion to them
- Jian: should this be funded for lunch/dinner?
- Ishaan: shouldn't be funded at all
- Chad: funding for 10-15 people (recommendation)
- Lunch for $10 /$ person
- 15 people attendance
